The Clagett Mission in Action - “Reaching for Success”

Providing a world-class coaching team:

A team of world-class coaches is assembled for the clinic and regatta. Coaches include Olympic athletes, world champion sailors, all-American collegiate sailors and professional coaches.

Delivering expert race management:

The volunteer race committee is made up of Paralympic/Olympic certified race management professionals, as well as international, national and club certified officials.

Providing an accessible marine facility

Fleet racing headquarters is located at Sail Newport Sailing Center in Fort Adams State Park. The facility is adapted to the needs of sailors with accessible ramps to floating docks, several lifts for sailors to board boats and ample storage areas for adaptive boats, trailers, and vehicles.

The *match racing* clinic and regatta is held in Oyster Bay, NY in partnership with Oakcliff Sailing Center.

Fleet Racing:

Newport, RI, The City-by-the-Sea

The backdrop for The Clagett is picturesque Newport Harbor. Newport has long been referred to as the “sailing capitol of the world.” No other area has hosted more America’s Cup campaigns and yachting events than Newport. The “City-by-the-Sea” has been the home to sailing waters of the America’s Cup, Volvo Ocean Race, Olympic and Paralympic Trials and thousands of local, national and world-class sailing regattas.

Regatta activities are centered at Rhode Island’s Public Sailing Center in Fort Adams State Park. Sail Newport is The Clagett event headquarters for the clinic, racing and social events.

July 2016 marked the inaugural year of the Clagett/Oakcliff Match Race Clinic and Regatta for sailors with adaptive needs. Led by one of sailings most respected coaches, Dave Perry, 24 sailors participated in Sonars. In August of 2017 both Dave Perry and Dave Dellenbaugh coached eight teams of Sonar sailors.

The match racing event translates the values and mission of The Clagett – expert coaching, competitive racing, as well as high intensity maneuvers, racing strategy and boat handling skills – to a new venue and racing format. Furthermore, providing sailors with new and challenging opportunities to “Reach for Success” is essential to the Clagett’s core mission.



The Clagett Regatta is proud to offer this event, for a third time in 2018, to eight teams of sailors with adaptive needs.

Partnerships with Oakcliff Sailing Center, the WaterFront Center, Sagamore Yacht Club (for 2018), and SailAhead are essential to the event’s success.

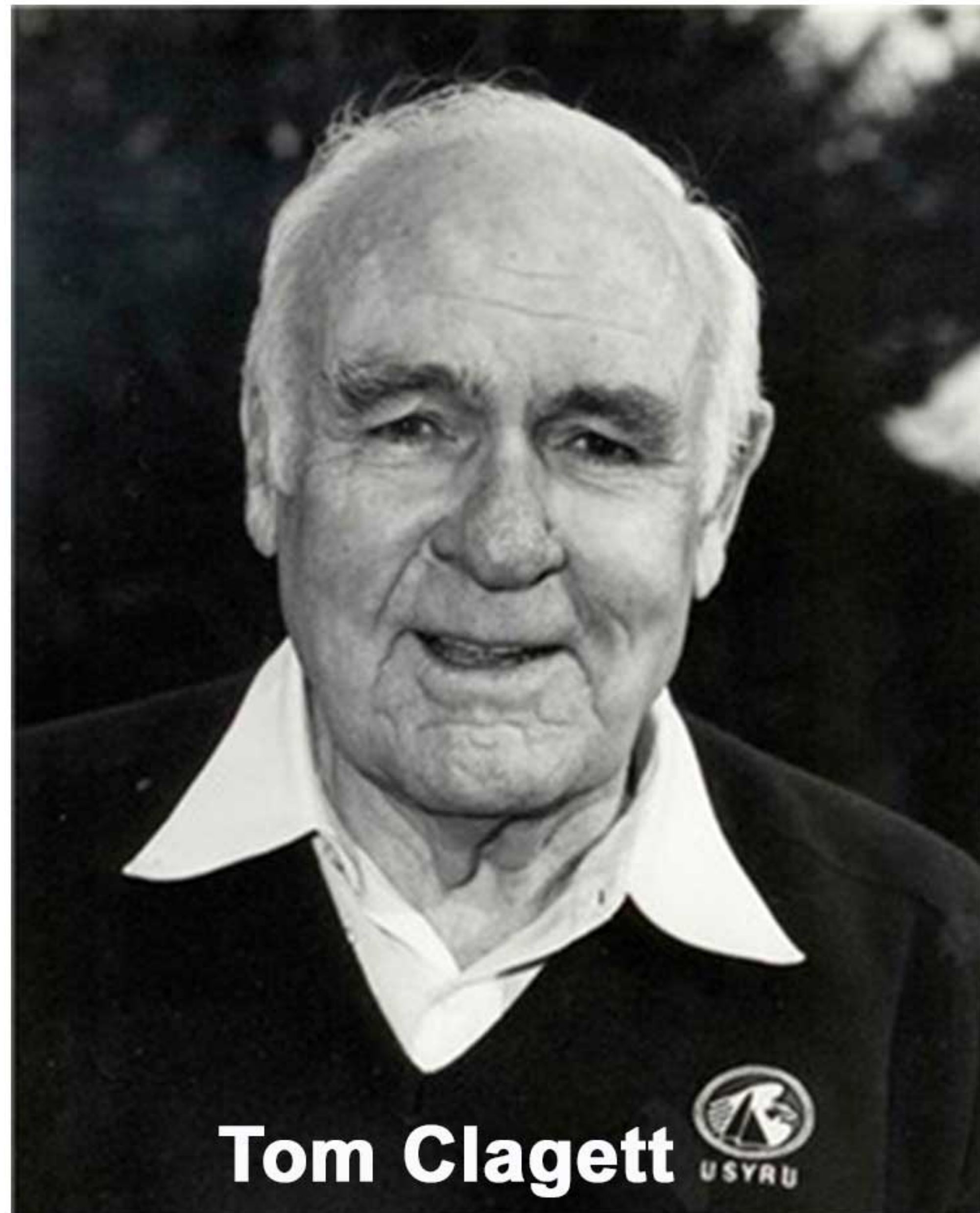

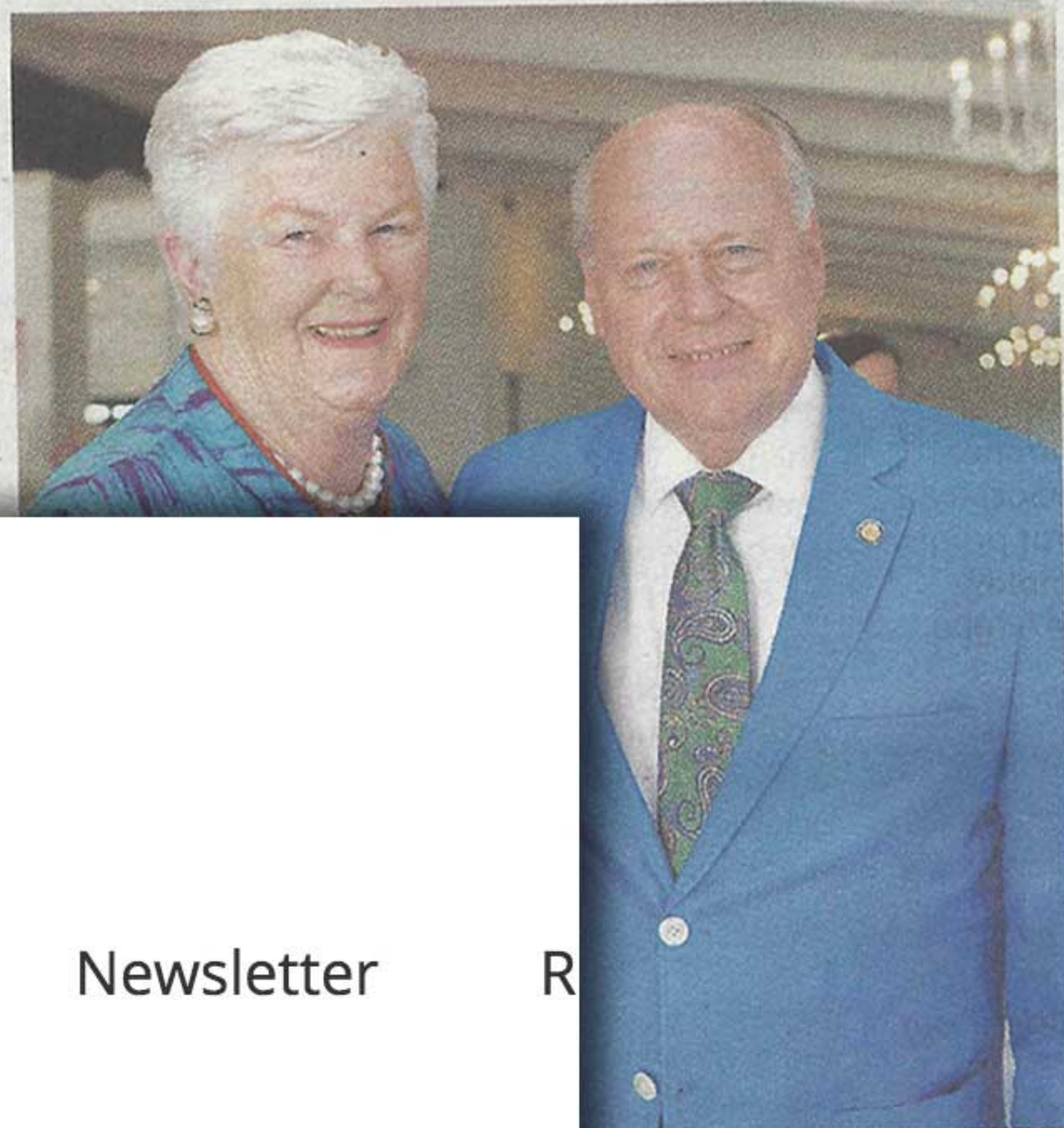

Twenty-five boats with dozens of sailors and crew were docked at the Sail Newport Aloft Pier at Fort Adams for the three-day Clagett Regatta at the end of June. Clagett champions crowned

NEWPORT - Three days and 10 races with 46 sailors from across North America concluded the 16th C. Thomas Clagett, Jr. Memorial Clinic and Regatta and the U.S. Para Sailing Championships on Sunday. "We couldn't do it without the support of the volunteers, sponsors, supporters and especially the sailors," Clagett President and Co-Founder Judy Clagett McLennan said in a press release. "We're so thrilled that we've been able to join forces with U.S. Sailing to host the U.S. Para Sailing Championships this year. We are working together to demonstrate the interest in sailing and to get it reinstated to the Paralympics."

class, Rio Paralympian and Silver Medalist Rick Doerr of Clifton, New Jersey, sailed with a graduate of the Warrior Sailing Program, Dawn Hart of Dade City, Florida, and Charles McClure of Brookline, Massachusetts, and led each day of the regatta. Securing second place overall was the team of Gary Pierce (Highland Park, Illinois), Patrick LoDuca (Chicago) and Jeff Long of Newport. "The competition pushed us and the level just keeps going up. The training is like no other regatta and it's just fantastic to be here with all these great sailors," Doerr said. "The challenges we have to overcome as sailors makes the results worthwhile. We owe it to others to set a high

to the future generations." In the 22-boat singlehanded 2.4mR fleet, the largest fleet in the regatta, Dee Smith of Annapolis, Maryland, managed to hold off the challengers Julio Reguero (Guaynabo, Puerto Rico) and Peter Wood (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada), to take home the gold medal with Reguero taking silver and Wood the bronze. The RS Venture Connect is a new class to adaptive sailing and the Clagett Regatta, and had seven teams racing in a round robin competition the first two days before the semifinals on Sunday. Claiming victory on Sunday was a former Paralympic duo from Canada - John McRoberts (Victoria, British Columbia) and Scott

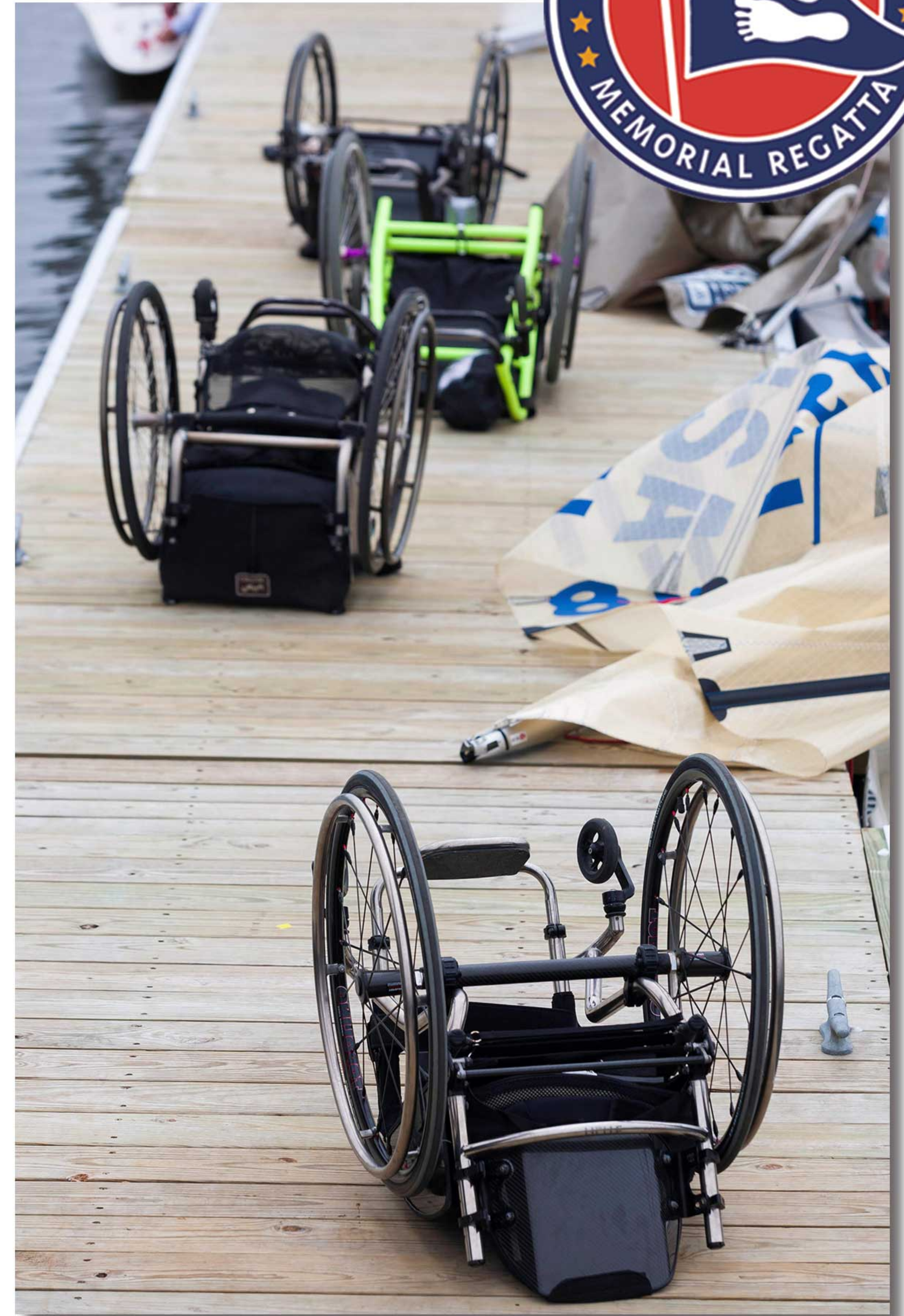

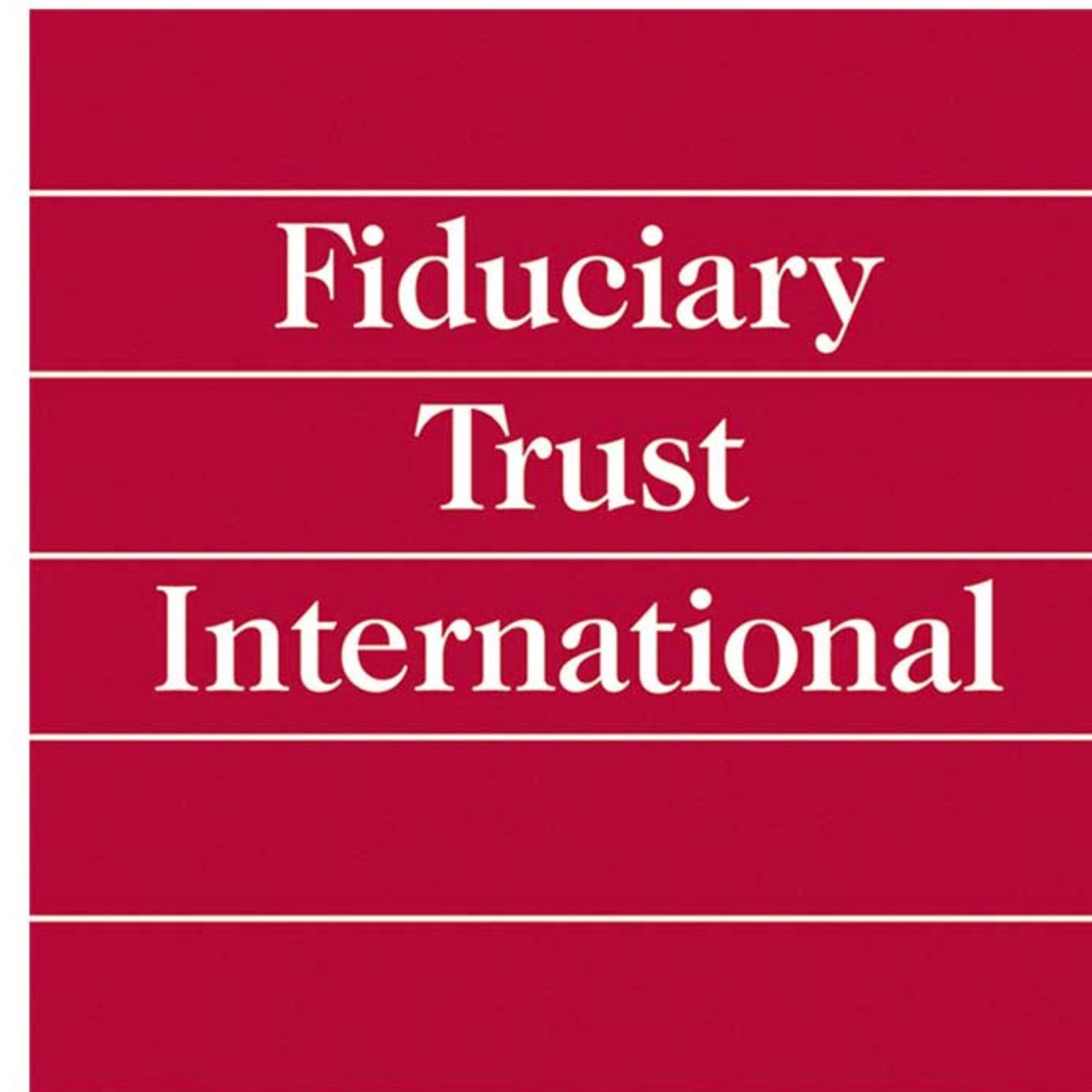
